Situated on the Verde River, this 300-acre oasis in the high desert of Arizona is surrounded by the majestic beauty of the Red Rocks to the north, Mingus Mountains to the west and the Hackberry Mountains to the south. The climate is moderate year round. Rich in geological and cultural history, the area provides hours of exploring and sightseeing, from the famous ghost town of Jerome to scenic drives through Sedona, ablaze with many colors. We have Wi-Fi access! Lease sites available.

Accommodations

Campsites: 265 full hookups, 44 power and water only, 5 tent sites, 12 extended vacation sites. Rentals: 14 trailers, 2 TT cabins. We offer only 30-amp electrical service at this preserve. We do not have any 50-amp service available, so please plan accordingly.

Member Amenities

Adult center, ballfield, basketball court, family centers, horseshoe pits, laundry facilities, meeting rooms, nature trail, playgrounds, propane, RC vehicle track, RV storage, shuffleboard, spa, swimming pool, trading post, volleyball court, Wi-Fi access.

Directions:

GPS Coordinates: N 34° 39' 43.37" W 111° 57' 51.25"; elevation is 3,356 feet.

From Flagstaff: Travel south on I-17 to Camp Verde, Exit 287. Turn off at Hwy. 260 and travel northwest about 8 miles. The preserve is on the right, between mileposts 212 and 211.

From Phoenix: Follow I-17 north to Hwy. 260 and travel northwest about 8 miles. The preserve is on the right, between mileposts 212 and 211.

From Prescott: Travel south on Hwy. 69 to Dewey, then northeast on Hwy. 169 to the I-17 junction. Take I-17 north to Hwy. 260 and travel northwest about 8 miles. The preserve is on the right, between mileposts 212 and 211.

Note: Hwy. 89A from Prescott to Cottonwood is not recommended.
