**R**ich in historic tradition, this preserve was built on the site of a former Indian village. Bear Cave is the only cavern in the Great Lakes area. Beautiful stalactites, flowstone, petrified leaves and strange shapes—all delicately colored by the metal oxides of native ores, are present throughout the cave. Outside, the area surrounding Bear Cave is rich in wooded hills, wildflowers and deep ravines. The resort is located on the St. Joseph River and is popular with fishermen. Lake Michigan is less than 20 miles west and Warren Dunes State Park is also easily accessible.

### Accommodations

Campsites: 70 hookups; 24 RPI, CTC & AOR sites; 5 tent sites; 16 long-term seasonal sites; overflow & storage sites. Rentals: 10 park models.

### Member Amenities

Basketball court, boat dock, boat launch, boat rentals, clubhouses, fishing, game room, general store, horseshoes, hot tub, laundry facility, pavilion, picnic area, playground, river frontage, shuffleboard, swimming pool, TV room.

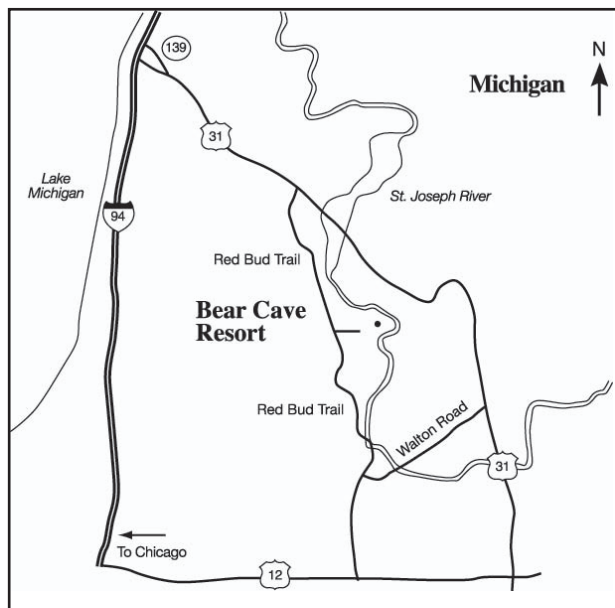

### Directions:

**GPS Coordinates:** N 41° 52' 55.80" and W 86° 21' 30.60"

**From Chicago:** Take I-94 to Rt. 12; go east on US 12 for approx 28 miles to Red Bud Trail. Turn left (north) on Red Bud Trail and proceed about six miles to the resort sign, which is on the right.

**From Detroit:** Take I-94 to Exit 30 (Napier to US 31). Turn left at top of exit ramp. Follow approximately 2 miles to US 31 S. Go approximately 10 miles to Exit 13 (Snow Rd). Turn right to first stop sign (Red Bud Trail). Turn left, go 3 miles to resort.

The 220 acres of this preserve offer wooded wilderness, valleys, rolling hills and a small flowing river. Just five miles east is the St. Clair River, one of the busiest waterways in the world. Visit nearby Port Huron, the boyhood home of Thomas Edison, and explore the Museum of Arts and History. The preserve is only one hour away from the world-renowned Henry Ford Museum and Greenfield Village.

### Accommodations

Campsites: 80 full hookups, 70 power and water only, overflow sites. Rentals: 13 trailers.

### Member Amenities

Adult center, basketball court, cross-country skiing, extended vacation sites, family center, game room, horseshoe pits, ice skating, laundry facilities, mini-golf, nature trails, playground, shuffleboard, sledding, swimming pool, trading post, volleyball court, Wi-Fi access.

### Directions:

**GPS Coordinates:** N 42° 51' 58.30" W 82° 33' 25.94"; elevation N/A.

**From Detroit:** Take I-94 northeast toward Port Huron, traveling about 50 miles from downtown Detroit. Take Exit 262 (Wadhams Rd.), turn and cross over I-94. The preserve entrance is on your right, immediately after crossing the highway.

**From Port Huron/Sarnia, Ontario:** Via the Blue Water Bridge, take I-94 southwest toward Detroit, traveling about 12 miles to Wadhams Rd, Exit 262. Turn right onto Wadhams Rd. and make an immediate right into the preserve.

**From Flint:** Take I-69 east to Port Huron and I-94. Take I-94 southwest, traveling about 9 miles to Wadhams Rd., Exit 262. Turn right onto Wadhams Rd. and make an immediate right into the preserve.

**Alternate Driving Directions From Flint:** Take I-69 East toward Port Huron. Take Wadhams Road South about 9 miles to preserve entrance on your left.
