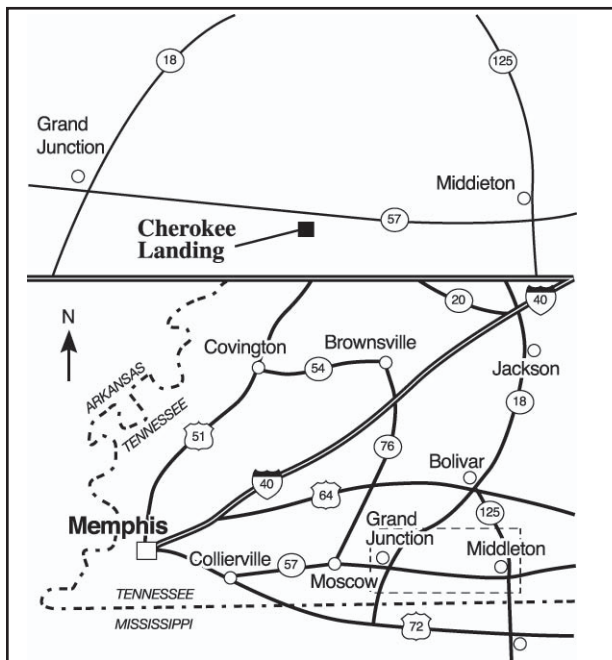

Directions:

GPS Coordinates: N 35° 1' 42.09" W 89° 1' 40.84"; elevation is 346 feet. Note: We do not recommend using GPS to find our preserve.

From Jackson, TN: From Interstate 40 take 45 bypass south to Hwy. 18 south to Bolivar. At second light in Bolivar (Courthouse Square) go through the light and then you're on 125 south to Middleton, turn west on Hwy. 57 and continue about 8 miles. Turn on Old State Line Road; there is no sign, so look for totem pole. Continue about 1.5 miles to the preserve.

From Memphis: Drive east to Collierville, follow Hwy. 72 to Hwy. 7, turn on Hwy. 7, which turns into Hwy. 18, (crossing the state line), follow Hwy. 18 to Grand Junction and turn right on Hwy. 57. Continue about 8 miles then turn right on Old State Line Road. There is no sign, so look for the totem pole. Continue about 1.5 miles to the preserve.

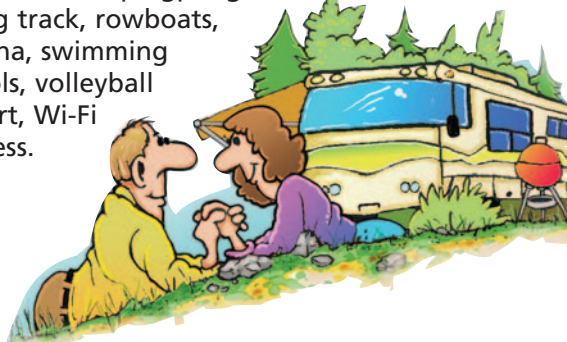
Located right off the scenic Natchez Trace Parkway, this 830-acre forested preserve features a large lake, complete with marina and fishing boat and canoe rentals. Nashville offers many sports and entertainment attractions. Other interesting day trips include Loretta Lynn's Dude Ranch in Lobelville and the home of President James Polk in Columbia.

Accommodations

Campsites: 126 full hookups, 391 power and water, 5 overflow sites. Rentals: 58 cabins.

Points of Interest:

Natchez Trace Parkway, 1/2 mile

Several TVA (Tennessee Valley Authority) dams, all about 50 miles
Nashville, 82 miles

Directions:

GPS Coordinates: N 35° 26' 3.70"
W 87° 28' 32.01"; elevation is 824 feet.

From Nashville: Take I-65 south to Saturn Parkway. Follow this road to US 31. Take US 31 south into Columbia. Turn onto US 412 west and follow for approximately 25 miles. Go south on the Natchez Trace Parkway for approximately 10 miles to the Napier Rd. exit. Bear to the right.

NOTE: After you turn onto Napier Rd., you will make a loop back under a Natchez Trace overpass. This bridge has an 11-foot clearance. If your rig is taller, there is a small dirt bypass on the opposite side of Napier Rd with a 13'6" clearance. To avoid the underpass, take State Rt. 64 from East or West to route 241. This will take you to the preserve entrance.
